Welcome

In cooperation with the U.S. Army Peacekeeping and Stability Operations Institute (PKSOI), the Peace Operations Training Institute (POTI) is proud to provide members of the U.S. Armed Forces with e-learning on UN Peacekeeping Operations.

Changes in the strategic and operational environment and mission sets require a greater understanding of UN-PKO, not just in working alongside UN field missions in conflict and PKO settings, but also in building the capacity of partner troop contributing countries through security sector assistance and other theater cooperation activities. These courses are ideal for forces involved in engagement activities in theater security cooperation settings. Among these are Civil Affairs and Regionally Aligned Forces.

POTI is a U.S.-based non-profit organization which provides several free courses on UN-PKO subjects. The multi-lingual curriculum is in use by military units, national peacekeeping training centers, UN peacekeeping missions, academic institutions, humanitarian organizations and individuals.

POTI provides globally accessible, self-paced, online, on-demand courses on peace support, humanitarian relief, and security operations in 194 countries. POTI is a member of the International Association of Peace Training Centres (IAPTC) and is "welcomed" each year in the annual report of the United Nations Special Committee on Peacekeeping Operations (C-34) to provide distance learning training to UN peacekeepers.

There are three ways to gain access to the courses – through the PKSOI website; through the Army Training Network/Regionally Aligned Forces Training Program, which requires a DoD Common Access Card (CAC); or through the POTI/PKSOI landing page:

Self-Paced – Online – On Demand

All aspects of study with POTI can be completed online. Students are able to sign up for courses, access texts, submit examinations, receive graded results, and be issued Certificates-of-Completion, at their convenience, at their own pace.

The POTI self-paced curriculum is open to all students of peacekeeping and humanitarian relief; there are no educational or professional requirements to become a student or sign up for courses. POTI has the most experience providing online learning on peace support, humanitarian relief, and security operations to individuals worldwide. During 2014, more than 36,000 people studied POTI courses.

Two levels of certification available:

- Individual courses: Students earn a Certificate-of-Completion for each completed course.
- Peace Operations Specialized Training (POST) Certificate: Earned by completing a topic-specific eightcourse sequence and comprehensive examination. Topics available are Military Studies; Police Studies; Civilian Service; Gender Awareness; Logistical Support; and Human Rights.
